Four days of excellence

True to the Officiel de France for several decades, the cream of the crop of the international show jumping scene is coming together for four days of Sport with a capital S. The stakes will be high from day one, with all riders aspiring to make their mark in each of their performances.

Each day will be filled with eagerly awaited highlights, consistently drawing in a large crowd around the arena and building up to the climax, the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule, on Sunday. Featuring eight competitions, including seven that count towards the world ranking, the 2024 edition of the French CSIO5* presents a total of €1,018,200 in prize money and promises the usual top-tier spectacle and a tidal wave of emotions.

HIGHLIGHTS

THURSDAY 6 june: Prix FFE, 1:50 pm

(Prize money: € 28,200)

In addition to providing an opportunity for the riders and their horses to acclimate to the environment and get a feel for the course in the François André Stadium, the opening day gives them the chance to shine from the get-go. A stellar performance in the Prix FFE comes with a ticket to the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule on Sunday.

FRIDAY 7 june : Coupe des nations Barrière, 1:30 pm

(Prize money: € 250,000)

Conceived in the early 20th century, Nations Cups are particularly coveted trophies around the world. For just one event, equestrian sports morph into a team sport and unleash a cocktail of emotions.

La Baule hosts the only 5* level Nations Cup, to wit, the Barrière Nations Cup. There are nine teams on the start list this year. In line with the recommendations of the riders, especially when it comes to horse welfare, each Nation will be represented by four combinations (with the three best scores taken into account). Only the top 8 teams from the first round will advance to the second one (held on the exact same course). The prospect of the major sporting event this summer in Versailles will add some extra flavour to the competition. The Blue Jackets will be eager to go back to their winning ways following their most recent triumph in 2017.

SATURDAY, 8 June: Derby Région Pays de la Loire – 2:15 pm

(Prize money: € 56,800)

The Derby Région Pays de la Loire never fails to keep the crowds in La Baule buzzing with anticipation. Water crossings, uphill and downhill banks, mounds and other natural obstacles usually found on a cross-country course... a derby is unique. Made in the image of the Officiel de France, the Derby Région Pays de la Loire is one of only two derbies held in the context of a CSIO5*. The Brazilian Nelson Pessoa, a five-time winner between 1975 and 1995, is a towering figure in the history of the event. Three-time winner Patrice Delaveau, last crowned in 2019, remains the most recent French

champion.

Three questions for Grégory Bodo

Grégory, what is the rationale behind these changes to the course of the Derby Région Pays de la Loire?

The Derby has long been a showpiece event of the CSIO. It is part of the competition's DNA. However, the start list for this event has got shorter in recent years. We wanted to shake up the course and return to the roots of the Derby, with more natural obstacles. We love this natural side. It also evokes the history of the Derby.

What was your approach?

The Derby is an official competition with clearly defined regulatory aspects. It must consist of at least 50% natural obstacles and cover a minimum distance of 1,000 metres. Safety is also paramount. It's important to stay vigilant and pre-empt any safety issues for both the rider and the horse. Without dwelling on the past too much, we need to take the historical dimension into account too, so I built upon the foundations of the Derby and added a touch of modernity.

What are the broad outlines of the new and revamped Derby Région Pays de la Loire?

The total number of obstacles will remain unchanged at 21. The combinations will ride around the entire course, tackling natural obstacles such as a water crossing, ramps, banks, a permanent water jump and a lake. Spectators in every corner of the stadium (from the grandstands to the lodges) will get to see the horses from up close at some point. The course will be straightforward, with few changes of hand, mirroring the great derbies of the world, such as Hamburg (GER), Calgary (CAN) and Hickstead (GBR).

I wanted to come up with a course that spices up the competition, electrifies the atmosphere and piques the riders' interest. That means putting together a course that is interesting from a sporting point of view, but which also has an «emotional» dimension, so that they feel they're doing something different. There's also a tinge of nostalgia for the spectators because this classic Derby will take them on a trip down memory lane. Seeing this course provide the backdrop to the action for many years to come would fill me with pride.



Prix Saur – 4:35 pm

(Prize money: € 110,000)

Is being the world number 1 a requirement to win the Prix Saur? The event with the second-biggest prize, which follows the Derby Région Pays de la Loire on the programme, tends to favour the rider at the top of the world ranking. Last year, it was the Swede Henrik von Eckermann and his mare Glamour Girl who took the spoils.

In 2022, the Swiss Martin Fuchs, then the world number 1, emerged victorious on The Sinner. As well as awarding a substantial haul of points for the world ranking, the Prix Saur is also a last-minute opportunity for the riders to snap up the last 8 spots in the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule.

SUNDAY, 9 june : Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule – 2 pm

(Prize money: € 500,000)

The list of winners of the Grand Prix de La Baule gives a sense of this larger-than-life event. Olympic gold medallists such as the Canadian Eric Lamaze and his fabulous mount, Hickstead, in 2011; the legendary combination of Pierre Durand and Jappeloup, who tasted glory in 1987; world champions such as the Frenchman Éric Navet, the Belgian Jos Lansink and the German Simone Blum; European champions such as Alexandra Ledermann and Roger-Yves Bost; World Cup winners, etc. The marble plate adorning the grandstand of the stadium, which bears the names of all the winners engraved in golden letters, is a who's who of the history of show jumping.

The 50 riders on the start list of the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de la Baule will be dreaming of adding their own names and repeating the exploit of the Belgian Nicola Philippaerts, who came out on top last year. The French can count on the unconditional support of the home crowds in their attempt to follow in the footsteps of Nicolas Delmotte, the last victorious Blue Jacket, who won on Urvoso du Roch in 2021.

Highlights of the CSI 1*

Starting on Thursday, 6 June, the CSI1* entrants will tackle their competitions in the same arena as the world elite. It will be an awe-inspiring experience for these riders, who are not as used to such grandiose venues.

On Saturday, 8 June, the CSI1* Derby, sponsored by Laiterie de Montaigu and held on an adapted course, will make them feel the same rush of adrenaline as the champions. The climax of the CSI1*, the Grand Prix Defender (€12,000 in prize money), will take place at 11:05 am on Sunday. The CSI1* has a total of €35,500 in prize money.

This year, **Sotheby's International Realty** will reward the CSI1* best rider! The CSI1* has a total of €37,500 in prize money.



La Baule sets the scene for a clash of titans

The field of the CSI5* has been unveiled with one week to go until the first horses trot into the arena of the Jumping International de La Baule — Officiel de France (6–9 June). The best riders on Earth, who never fail to show up for the event, will once again descend on the François André Stadium. Many of the riders on the start list will be representing one of the nine teams registered for the prestigious Barrière Nations Cup, and every single one of them will be eager to produce a stellar performance over the four-day event, with the Rolex Grand Prix de la Ville de La Baule as the icing on the cake.

The course is ready, the seats are waiting for the crowds and the stands that make up the various villages have set up shop in the aisles of the François André Stadium. Just a week from now, the riders and their horses will storm into the arena, determined to shine in an event close to their hearts. The 2024 edition boasts a star-studded field, with a whole constellation of world, European, North American and South American champions, as well as Olympic gold medallists.

Several action-packed moments stand out from the programme between Thursday and Sunday. On Friday, the Barrière Nations Cup will put 36 combinations representing nine nations to the test, with the top eight progressing to the second round. It will be a golden opportunity for all the chefs d'équipe to make the last few tweaks before the Olympic event in Versailles next summer.

France, which last finished top of the class in 2017, will be eager to shine on home turf again. The national coach, Henk Nooren, and the federal team have selected Roger-Yves Bost (Delph de Denat HDC), Simon Delestre (I Amelusina R 51), Olivier Robert (Iglesias DV), Jeanne Sadran (Dexter de Kerglenn) and Kevin Staut (Visconti du Telman) to represent the Blue Jackets. «La Baule is one of the most special events of the season because it features the Nations Cup», pointed out Kevin Staut. «The competition has stayed true to its identity.

The crowd includes diehard fans who come every single day, but also others who take their pick depending on what they like best. It's brilliant. Historic events such as this one bring our sport to a whole new level.»

The French chef d'équipe will also be watching the 13 individual entrants from up close: Nicolas Delmotte, Marie Demonte, Marc Dilasser, Olivier Perreau, Nicolas Layec, Julien Gonin, François-Xavier Boudant, Edward Levy, Pierre-Marie Friant, Mégane



Moissonier, the 2016 Olympic gold medallist in the team event Philippe Rozier, the French champion Cédric Hurel and Philippe Léoni.

The reigning champions and 2018 winners, Brazil, will be relying on Luiz Felipe de Azevedo Filho, Luciana Diniz, Luciana Lossio, Yuri Mansur Santiago Lambre to mount a successful title defence.

Sweden, the current world champions and Olympic gold medallists, never perform better than when faced with a real challenge. The Swedes will be hoping to add their names to the honour roll for the first time with Angelica Augustsson Zanotelli, Peder Fredricson, Amanda Landeblad, Petronella Andersson and Linda Heed.

Meanwhile, Switzerland, who triumphed in 2019 and 2021, will be fielding a fiercely competitive team in the shape of Steve Guerdat (world no. 3), Martin Fuchs (no. 5), Pius Schwizer, Edouard Schmitz and Alain Jufer. «It's one of the best events of the season, no doubt about that», said Guerdat, an Olympic gold medallist in 2012. «It has an extraordinary course and a fantastic stadium with an atmosphere that blows



you away. The event features my three favourite competitions: the Grand Prix, the Nations Cup and the Derby. It has also managed to change with the times without sacrificing its tradition. It's the whole package.»

Despite being one of the major powers of the sport for many decades, Germany have not won in Loire-Atlantique since 2007. Die Mannschaft will be counting on Marcus Ehning, Kendra Clarica Brinkop, the recent victor of the Grand Prix 4* in Bourg-en-Bresse, Jörne Sprehe, Philipp Weishaupt and David Will to end their drought.

The United States, whose last success in La Baule dates back to 2005, are bringing some serious firepower to bear in Loire-Atlantique, with Kent Farrington (no. 6) and McLain Ward (no. 9) leading the charge and Karl Cook, recent winner of the

Rolex Grand Prix de Rome, Lillie Keenan and Aaron Vale bringing up the rear. The Americans came up second in their latest appearance, back in 2016.

Belgium have emerged victorious from La Baule four times (1999, 2008, 2012 and 2022) and will be banking on Olivier and Nicola Philippaerts (no. 15), Jérôme Guéry, Wilm Vermeir and Grégory Wathelet. Spain, back on the shores of the Atlantic for the first time since 2018, have clinched a single edition, 2002. The top 100 riders Eduardo Álvarez Aznar and Mariano Martínez Bastida will be among those flying the flag for the Spanish Armada in La Baule.

Austria, who have been building on their bronze medal at the last European Championship, will also be in the mix with Max Kühner, who cracked the world top 10 a few months ago.

International riders who have signed up as individual entrants include the Irishman Shane Sweetnam (no. 12), the Briton Lily Attwood, the Liechtensteiner Jennifer Hochstadter, the Italians Lorenzo de Luca and Gampiero Garofalo, the Norwegian Victoria Gulliksen, the Mexican Federico Fernández, the Dutchman Lars Kersten and the Colombians Roberto Terán and René López.

Jean-Lou Bigot Premier Français d'Europe champion individuel en 1993 Twist la Beige (argent par équipe), vice-champion du monde par équipe en 1994 et 1998, membre de l'équipe de France aux Jeux olympiques de Sydney en 2000, Jean-Lou Bigot est un des grands noms du complet tricolore.

Karim Laghouag Médaillé d'or olympique par équipe à Rio en 2016, avec Entebbe de Hus. puis de bronze à Tokyo, en 2021, avec Triton Fontaine, Karim Laghouag est à 48 ans. une valeur sûre des Bleus. En 2013, 2015, et 2023, il s'est également offert le bronze par équipe lors des championnats d'Europe.

Stéphane Landois Médaillé de bronze par équipe lors des derniers championnats d'Europe organisés Haras du Pin, l'été dernier, avec Ride for Thaïs Chaman Dumonceau, Stéphane

Landois symbolise à bientôt 30 ans la nouvelle génération de la discipline.

Maxime Livio Actuel numéro 1 tricolore au classement mondial concours complet (13e au ranking de mai), Maxime Livio, 36 ans, a participé à la médaille de bronze mondiale par équipe en 2018, à Tryon (USA), avec Opium de Verrières.

Astier Nicolas Placés en ouvreurs des Bleus aux Jeux olympiques de Rio, 2016, Astier Nicolas et Piaf de B'Neville, lançaient parfaitement les Tricolores vers l'or par équipe. La médaille d'argent en individuel allait ensuite récompenser leur superbe performance.

Nicolas Touzaint Champion olympique par équipe en 2004 à Athènes, double champion d'Europe individuel en 2003 et 2007 avec Galan de Sauvagère et multi médaillé par équipe dans les grands championnats, Nicolas Touzaint est depuis plus de deux décennies le pilier de l'équipe de France. Lors des

derniers Jeux olympiques, à Tokyo, il est encore reparti avec la médaille de

bronze par équipe.

Coming together in the villages

Focus on the « Bar à Champagne »



A competition poster is a testimony to its history. The equestrian world has become accustomed to turning them into works of art. Animal artist and former member of the French show jumping team, Olivier Jouanneteau designed the poster for the 2024 edition of Jumping International de La Baule - Officiel de

France. I'm very flattered to have been asked, as I was last year, to design the poster for this competition, which holds a very special place in the history of equestrian sports and is one of the most beautiful competitions in the world,» he confides. It's a real honor. This partnership highlights my work. I had a lot of discussions with the organizers. The idea was to represent several horses and to convey the feeling of power and determination during a jump. The different-colored jackets show the international aspect of the event, with, for example, the color of Brazil, winner of last year's Nations Cup. But blue, white and red are logically the first to catch the eye.»

Olivier Jouanneteau will once again be present in the competition's exhibitors' village. He will be exhibiting his works on his stand, and his canvases throughout the event's VIP hospitality areas.

The vet check upon the arrival of the horses, talking to the jury, exploring the heart of the village and the hospitality area, roaming the paddock... Charlotte and Alex will publish a video magazine every evening on the Jumping's website and Instagram account.

The videos will also be packed with interviews with the top performers of the day, who will share their emotions and analysis. The magazine will combine education and entertainment. The «equestrian minute» will help viewers learn about a wide range of subjects. There will also be practical information and, of course, the results of the day and the programme for the next day.

Horses at the heart of everything we do



Horse welfare has long been a guiding principle for the Jumping International de La Baule — Officiel de France. It is a top priority, but also something that comes naturally. The entire competition team understands the importance of this issue. The Officiel de France has applied for EquuRES, the environmental and animal welfare label for the equine sector.

5-star accommodation for the horses

More than 98% of the participating horses are accommodated in boxes belonging to the building, which guarantees optimal comfort. The box units do not exceed more than 26 boxes in the same barn. Each barn has its own shower and is well ventilated.

The litters used are 100% natural, made of dusted wood and from sustainable forest management (PEFC label: Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification). The bedding thus creates a comfortable mattress and reduces the risk of respiratory problems in horses. A grassland and relaxation area is available near the stables.

The beach as a haven of physical and mental well-being

The top horses in the world relaxing on the beach as the sun peeks over the horizon have become a regular view in La Baule. It is a salutary experience for the champions, who dip into the sea to get a natural

muscle and tendon massage from the waves. The beach, which stretches for several kilometres, boosts their morale. This exceptional outing, held under the supervision of FEI stewards and the municipal police, takes place in strict compliance with the health regulations in force.



A sporting programme built around horse welfare

The events are scheduled and organised to keep the burden on horses to a bare minimum. For the Barrière Nations Cup, the Jumping International de La Baule has retained a format consisting of four combinations per team with a drop score (i.e. the worst result in each round does not count towards the final score). This format, which has met with widespread acclaim among the riders, is a boon to horse welfare because it does not force riders to finish a round at all costs to save their teams from elimination.

The «Horse welfare» space, which saw the light of day last year, is returning to the 2024 exhibitors' village. Run jointly with Equus Project, a global project that aims to create the right ecosystem for the development of horses and people, this space will bring horse welfare professionals together. Conferences will be held throughout the competition about this vision, which permeates every aspect of the sector, namely: feed, training in horserelated professions, equine meditation, equicoaching and equine care.

The Testimony

Kevin Staut: «It pulls out all the stops to keep horses happy»

«Animal welfare is something that comes naturally. When you strive for excellence, you are passionate about basic, fundamental concepts, in other words, everything around the horse. Animal welfare is at the core of everything we build. We need to spread the word about this approach even further. The organisers play a key role in all of this. I've been blessed with the chance to be part of the competition in La Baule for a long time. I've followed the trend that goes hand in hand with this focus on welfare. What sets La Baule apart is that you have a pressure cooker —the main track—for the events, but just a few metres away you have the stable area, where everything is nice and quiet and the pressure just melts away. Both the horses and the people who take care of them can kick back and relax here between one event and the next. They also



get to enjoy a grass field where they can spend the day relaxing before heading to the sand warm-up track. The stables are permanent and made from wood, with wide aisles. On top of that, the main track undergoes constant improvements. FEI stewards oversee beach outings to make sure everything is done by the book. This competition leaves nothing to chance. It pulls out all the stops to keep horses happy.»
